Bandera County Flood Warning System

The Bandera County River Authority and Groundwater District (BCRAGD) is expanding its early flood warning system on the Medina River and adding the Sabinal River as part of the county's program. The system is operated and maintained by USGS and includes water level, flow rate, and rainfall. To receive text or e-mail alerts sign up at http://water.usgs.gov/water alert and click on Bandera Patterson Rd. or Bandera Park. The new sites are not yet up and reporting.

Cleaning Lake Medina Shore Line

With the lake down to 13% capacity many areas of shoreline have revealed old drums used for dock flotation not seen in decades. In some areas they litter the shoreline by the dozens and are not only an eye sore but can be dangerous.

Medina River Protection Fund, Inc.

The Lake Medina Conservation Society (LAMCOS) began the Medina River Cleanup in 2001. In 2004 LAMCOS established the Medina River Protection Fund (MRPF) as an advised fund within the Bandera Community Foundation, a 501(c)(3) organization. In 2008 the fund was incorporated and LAMCOS applied to the IRS for 501(c)(3) status which was granted. The Medina River Protection Fund, Inc. is an independent public charity.

LAMCOS supports the thirteenth annual Medina River Cleanup which will be held on May 4, 2013 at the Bandera City Park. Registration is 9 – 12 am and group/family participation is encouraged. All participants will be provided with free t-shirts and food service from 9 am – 6 pm. Free camping with hot showers is also available.
